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Class Procedures:

Class begins when the bell rings! NO EXCEPTIONS! Students MUST have a pass if they are late. Come to every class prepared! Homework Policy:

Electronics Policy:

- 4th Warning: Device will be taken and the parent will have to come and get it

Grading Policy:

As per the Morris Central School Student Handbook, each student will be graded as follows:

Homework = 40%

Tests will include Chapter or Unit tests, Research Projects, DBQ's (Document Based Questions), and formal essays. All other work and work completed in class will fall under the Homework heading; this would also include class participation. Participation is a required part of this class.
