Check our classroom calendar or Google Classroom for homework details daily.

- Based on the quality and in depth quality of work done in and out of class. (Rubrics usually provided)
- You can expect quizzes, periodic unit exams and weekly writing assignments and reading assignments for homework. Major writing assignments count as test grades.
- Daily participation will count toward your homework grade.
- All quizzes, tests, and projects will be taken or handed in on the day that they are due. You will know far enough in advance about these assignments, so there will be no excuses. If you did not study, you cannot make up the grade.
- Many assignments will be due in class; others will be due by midnight the day they are due, via Google Classroom. Be aware of each assignment's due time.

What is it Worth?

- Unit tests, larger writing assignments and research projects will be worth 60 percent of each quarter's grade. Homework assignments, weekly participation, and quizzes are worth 40 percent of your quarterly grade.
- Daily preparation and participation will count as an overall grade for each week in the following manner:
