Course Overview:

The purpose of this course is to provide the student with a well-rounded survey of US History & Government. Grade 11 begins with the colonial and constitutional foundations of the United States and explores the government structure and functions provided in the Constitution. The development of the nation and the political, social, and economic factors that led to the challenges our nation faced in the Civil War are addressed. Industrialization, urbanization, and the accompanying problems are examined, along with America's emergence as a world power, the two world wars of the 20th century, and the Cold War. Students explore the expansion of the federal government, evolving social beliefs and behaviors, and the nation's place in an increasingly globalized and interconnected world.

Class Procedures

Class begins when the bell rings! **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Students **MUST** have a pass if they are late. Come to every class prepared! Bring notebooks, pencils, and have any completed assignments if assigned.

The day's agenda will be posted in the classroom. Follow the instructions.

Homework Policy

Homework is due the day it is assigned. **NO LATE HOMEWORK WILL BE ACCEPTED!** If you are absent on the day homework is due, you have until the next class to hand in that homework. If you choose not to do it a zero will be given. An extra day will be given for each absence to make up the missed work.

Electronics Policy

Electronics and technology will be used often in class. However, cell phones must be turned off or on silent when entering class. I take this policy **VERY** seriously. If these rules are not followed the policy is as follows:

- 1st Warning: Verbal, student will be asked to put device away.
- 2nd Warning: Device will be taken for the rest of class period.
- 3rd Warning: Device will be taken for the rest of the day.
- 4th Warning: Device will be taken and the parent/guardian will have to come and get it.

Grading Policy

As per the Morris Central School Student Handbook, each student will be graded as follows:

Tests = 60%

Homework = 40%

Tests will include Chapter or Unit Tests, Research Projects, DBQ's (Document Based Questions), and formal essays.

All other work and work completed in class will fall under the Homework heading; this would also include class participation. Participation is a required part of this class.
